I refer to your email dated 2 November 2023 in which you asked for information in relation to cases of disclosing private sexual imagery. Your request has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Freedom of Information Act 2000

The Freedom of Information Act creates rights of access for any person making a request for information to a public authority. The rights of access are twofold. First, to be informed by the public authority if it holds information of the description specified in the request, and if that is the case, secondly, to be provided with that information. These rights are subject to important limitations, which are designed to achieve a proper balance between the right to know and considerations of law and policy in the broader public interest.

You had asked the following:

Under Freedom of Information legislation please provide the number of cases of disclosing private sexual imagery (revenge porn) to be prosecuted per calendar year since the introduction of this law, indicating how many of same were directed on indictment.

In response, please see Table 1 below which provides details of prosecutorial decisions issued in respect of "disclosing private sexual photographs and film with intent to cause distress".

Table 2 details the description of the offence considered in the analysis.
