I refer to your e-mail dated 10<sup>th</sup> January 2024 in which you asked for information relating to the Theft Act (Northern Ireland) 1969. Your request has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

## Freedom of Information Act 2000

The Freedom of Information Act creates rights of access for any person making a request for information to a public authority. The rights of access are twofold. First, to be informed by the public authority if it holds information of the description specified in the request, and if that is the case, secondly, to be provided with that information. These rights are subject to important limitations, which are designed to achieve a proper balance between the right to know and considerations of law and policy in the broader public interest.

You asked the following:

"I would like to request figures for 2021, 2022 and 2023 for the numbers of the below offences in which a prosecution commenced.

• Theft Act (Northern Ireland) 1969 Section 13 Abstracting of Electricity."

In response, please be advised the figures for 2021, 2022 and 2023 can be found in the table below, which also provides data in respect of prosecutorial decisions and no prosecution decisions issued for offences under the Section 13 of the Theft Act (Northern Ireland) 1969. The specific offences considered in the analysis are also included.
