I refer to your email dated 20 February 2025 in which you requested information. Your request has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Freedom of Information Act 2000

The Freedom of Information Act creates rights of access for any person making a request for information to a public authority. The rights of access are twofold. First, to be informed by the public authority if it holds information of the description specified in the request, and if that is the case, secondly, to be provided with that information. These rights are subject to important limitations, which are designed to achieve a proper balance between the right to know and considerations of law and policy in the broader public interest.

You had asked the following:

"I am trying to find out further information in relation to the 53 legacy cases that the PPS has considered following Police Service of Northern Ireland investigations between 2012 and the start of April 2024. Is there a list available of the cases where charges were brought and where convictions were subsequently secured?"

In response to your request for a list available of the cases, where charges were brought and where convictions were subsequently secured between 2012 and April 2024, I can advise that there were six cases where charges were brought, and convictions were secured in relation to Legacy cases during that period. These involved the [REDACTED]
