Dear Sir/Madam,

I refer to your email dated 4 March 2019 in which you asked for information about prosecutions for crimes involving the use of a drone in 2018.

Your request has been dealt with under the terms of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Freedom of Information Act 2000

The Freedom of Information Act creates rights of access for any person making a request for information to a public authority. The rights of access are twofold. First, to be informed by the public authority if it holds information of the description specified in the request, and if that is the case, secondly, to be provided with that information. These rights are subject to important limitations, which are designed to achieve a proper balance between the right to know and considerations of law and policy in the broader public interest.

You had asked for the following:

- 1) How many prosecutions took place in 2018 for the use of a drone to commit a criminal offence? These are crimes that would typically be prosecuted using the Air Navigation Order legislation.
- How many prosecutions took place in 2018 in total of all crimes? (This is just to derive a percentage of drone prosecutions versus all other crime).

The legislation that relates to the flying of a small unmanned surveillance aircraft without permission such as a drone is 'Article 241(1) and (6) of the Air Navigation Order 2009.'

In response please see Table 1 below for statistics in relation to decisions issued by the PPS in 2018 under this legislation and Table 2 for all decisions issued in 2018 where the test for prosecution was met.
